 temporal Estate with which it hath pleased God to  
 bless me after payment of my just Debts and funeral  
 Expenses I give devise and bequeath the same as  
 followeth that is to say unto John Pimbury of  
 Johns Coffee House in Cornhill London one hundred  
 pounds ~~to John Pimbury my Man in case he~~  
~~live with me at the time of my decease fifty pounds~~  
 John Ellis of Elmswick Esquire as an acknowledgment  
 for the many good and kind services he hath done for  
 me and my late Husband deceased twenty pounds  
 and to Samuel Robertson of Great Street London  
 five pounds and all the Rest Residue and  
 Remainder of my Estate whatsoever and wheresoever  
 I give devise and bequeath unto my two Sisters  
 Ann Pimbury of Johns Coffee House in Cornhill  
 the said Coffee House and Elizabeth Ellis the  
 wife of William Ellis of Clifton in the County of  
 York Carpenter and the survivor of them and  
 do hereby nominate and appoint my said Sisters  
 the said Ann Pimbury and Elizabeth Ellis joint  
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
 and I do hereby revoke all former and other  
 Wills by me at any time heretofore made and do

publish and declare this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven. Sarah George  
Signed sealed published and declared as the said Testatrix is and for her last will and testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed. Appeared personally Robert Hughes of Bow Street in the parish of Saint Paul Covent Garden in the County of Middlesex Button Greber and John Pinchney of Cornhill in the parish of Saint Andrew Cornhill London Coffee Dran and being sworn on the Holy Evangelists to depose the truth severally made oath as follows to wit and first the said Robert Hughes for himself saith that he was Sarah George's widow late of Great Russell Street in the parish of Saint Paul Covent Garden in the County of Middlesex a Button Seller deceased and that she departed this life about five o'clock at noon on the nineteenth day of May last and thereupon he sent a message to Ann Pinchney informing her that her sister the said Sarah George was dead that in consequence of such information the said Ann Pinchney and the said John Pinchney came to the house of the said deceased about five o'clock the same day that this deposition and the said John Pinchney <sup>by the desire of the said John Pinchney</sup> went up stairs in the said room of the said deceased where she used to lay and found in a small box in a closet in the said bedroom amongst other papers the will of the said deceased inclosed in a cover and the following words endorsed thereon the will of Sarah George and they thereupon brought the same down stairs to the said Ann Pinchney and on opening the said cover found the will hereunto annexed and on viewing the same he this deposition <sup>applying to the following</sup> interlineation and obliterations <sup>to get the interlineation</sup> this sheweth as followeth that is to say between the tenth and eleventh lines the obliteration "To John Ellworth my layman in case he lives with me at the time of my decease fifty pounds" "Co" in the twelfth and thirteenth lines and the obliteration "Samuel Robertson of Fleet Street London Esq or Comptroller in the sixteenth line respectively to be computed from the top of the said will and the said John.

Pynchney for himself saith that he and the said  
 Ann Pynchney went to the house of the said Sarah  
 George about five o'clock in the afternoon of the  
 said nineteenth day of May last in consequence  
 of the said Ann Pynchney's message from the said  
 Robert Hughes acquainting her with the death  
 of the said deceased and that he this deponent  
 and the said Robert Hughes on going up stairs -  
 into the Bed Room of the said deceased found in  
 a Box in a Closet in the said Bed Room the Will  
 of the said deceased under Cover and endorsed as  
 follows "The Will of Sarah George" that they -  
 thereupon opened the said Cover in the presence of  
 the said Ann Pynchney and found the Will therein  
 unsealed and by this deponents perusing the same  
 observed the Interdications and Alterations as  
 before particularly sworn to by the said Robert  
 Hughes and the said Robert Hughes and John  
 Pynchney jointly make Oath that the said Will  
 is in all respects in the same plight and Condition  
 as when they so found the same save the said Cover  
 and the Jurat wrote thereon and they lastly say  
 that John Ellworth a Segas named in the said  
 Will was not in the service of the said deceased at  
 the time of her death and that Samuel Robertson  
 the other Segas named in the said Will died in
